

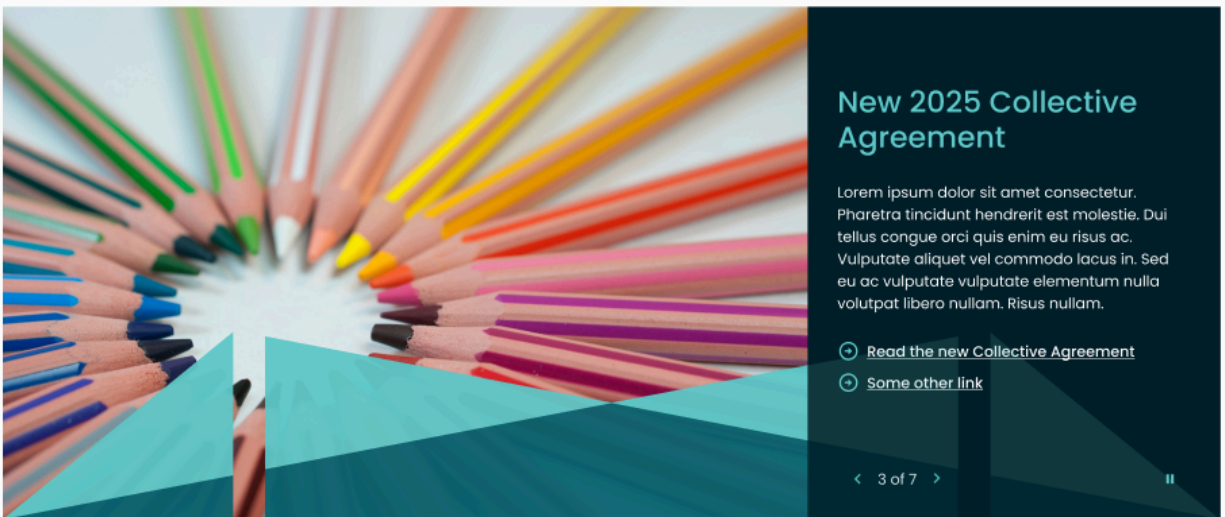

Paragraph Planning

Home Banner Content Block



A content block that contains a paragraph that contains the Home banner

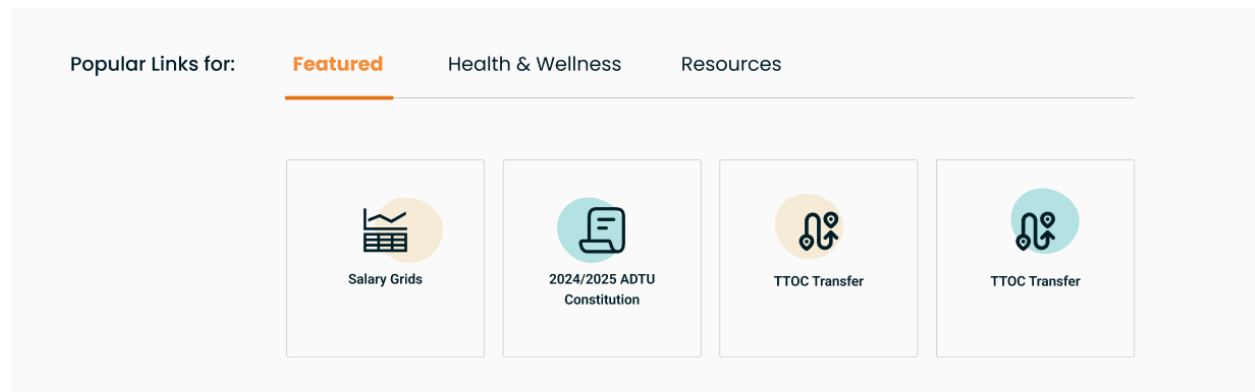
Paragraph Structure:

- Banner Image (Media)
- Banner slide (View reference)

OR,

- remove paragraph, hardcode into content block

Home Tab Nav Content Block

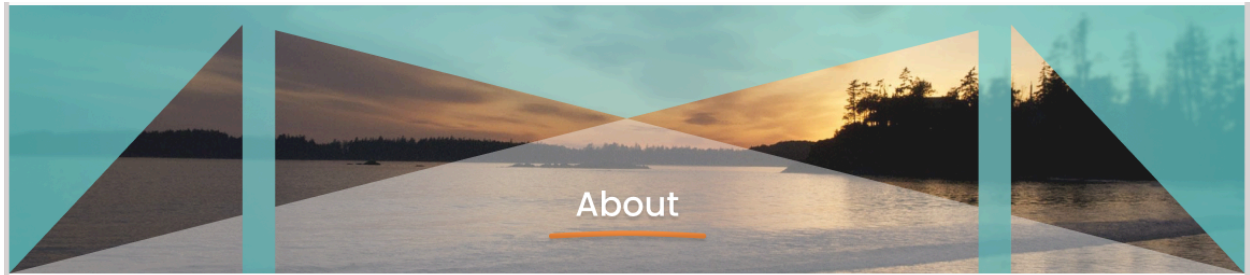


- Each popular links category (i.e, Featured) will be a Paragraph: Popular Link Paragraph
- The Home Tab Nav Content Block will have a parent Paragraph that takes an unlimited amount of Popular Link Paragraph
- Each Popular Link Paragraph will have the following structure:
 - Link Title (short unformatted text OR taxonomy reference)
 - View reference - referencing a view that references the list of matching links
- Each Link (i.e, Salary Grids) will be a content block containing link text and icon
- In Twig template: use a for loop to render all Link Title and View references, hide all other non-active View references by assigning CSS attributes, use Javascript to toggle active View references

OR,

- use menu. the featured links can be children of link category (ex, Salary Grids can be a children of Featured)
 - Issue: will be more challenging to display icons and other custom styles

Other Banner Content Block

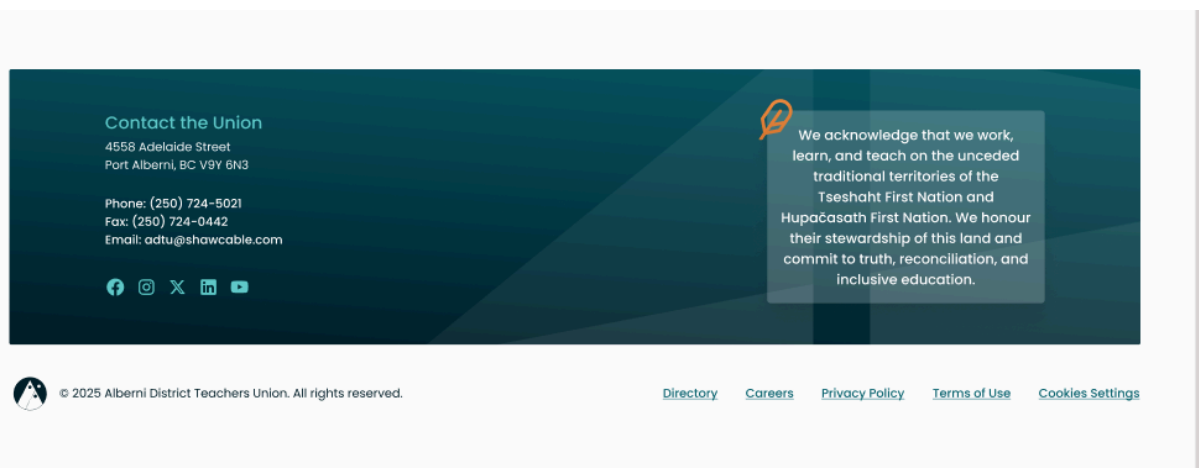

- Link Component (optional)

Understanding Workplace Violence

WorkSafeBC defines workplace violence as:

"...the attempted or actual exercise by a person, other than a worker, of any physical force so as to cause injury to a worker, and includes any threatening statement or behaviour which gives a worker reasonable cause to believe that the worker is at risk of injury."

Examples of workplace violence include throwing objects, physical aggression, verbal threats, swearing, hitting, kicking, and spitting. Individuals who pose a risk of violence may include students, parents/guardians, and the general public.

Reporting Violent Incidents

Members who experience violence, feel threatened, or are injured must report the incident as soon as possible.

- **Step 1:** Report the situation to your **Administrator** immediately.
- **Step 2:** Complete [WorkSafeBC Form 6A](#) and the [SD70 Employee Report of Violence](#).
- **Step 3:** If there is a loss of work time due to the violent incident, report it to WorkSafeBC using [Teleclaim](#).
- **Step 4:** Administration must ensure a **mutually agreed Action Plan** is developed and implemented before the return of the individual who created the risk of violence.

Definition of Policy

Policies will provide guidance on issues over which the Union does not have complete control. A policy statement reflects the fundamental beliefs that guide the actions of the Union.

1.0 Accountability - 2007

1.1 That accountability be defined as the process through which individuals, organizations, and governments take responsibility for actions, report on actions taken, and improve performance.

1.2 That the support and enhancement of student learning, including cognitive and affective learning outcomes, be the focus of educational accountability.

1.3 That the public educational system be accountable for the attainment of educational goals, taking into account contextual factors that may affect results.

1.4 That quality classroom-based student assessment in which teachers employ an array of methods over time incorporating authentic forms of assessment aligned with Curriculum be given precedence in an educational accountability model.

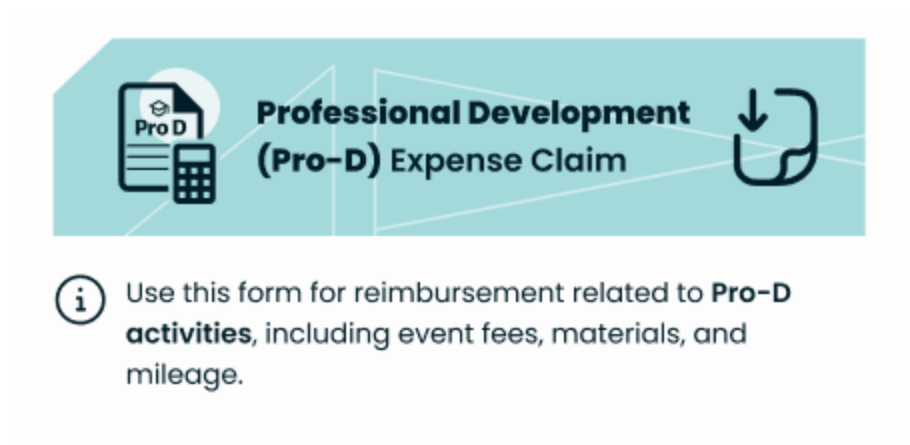
